



2020 COVID-19 GUIDELINES FOR CAMP

In compliance with guidelines put in place by Maryland's Governor as well as the CDC, ADA, and the Anne Arundel County Department of Health, the Severna Park Community Center (SPCC) has put together the following guidelines for the 2020 Summer Camp Season:

- SPCC facilities are cleaned and disinfected throughout the day and overnight. Plexiglass barriers are installed at the front desk.
- Hand sanitizing stations, with hand sanitizer that is at least 60% alcohol, are positioned throughout the center. Campers will be asked to sanitize their hands between activities as well as upon arrival and at departure.
- SPCC employees wear protective face coverings at all times and upon arrival for work, acknowledge they are not experiencing any symptoms that could indicate illness and that they have not been around anyone exhibiting symptoms that could indicate illness.
- SPCC employees are trained on all health and safety policies and procedures and adhere to all cleaning requirements and physical distancing guidelines.
- In the event a student, SPCC employee, or any other person becomes unwell while on site, they will be moved to an isolated location immediately, and proper health & safety procedures will be followed to ensure both their safety and the safety of all others inside the facility. Parents will be contacted to pick their camper up.
- Any parent/guardian that becomes aware of their child exhibiting a fever of 100.4 degrees (Fahrenheit) or higher, coughing, or any other symptoms that indicate illness, will be asked to keep their child at home. Any parent/guardian that becomes aware that someone living in the same home as their child is exhibiting a fever of 100.4 degrees (Fahrenheit) or higher, coughing, or any other symptoms that indicate illness will be asked to keep their child at home. In the event that your child tests positive for an illness, they must complete a 14-day self-quarantine prior to returning to SPCC. In some cases, SPCC may require a doctor's note prior to allowing a camper to return to the center.
- Everyone must wear a face mask to protect yourself and others at SPCC. This includes when you drop off and pick up your children. Campers will wear masks at all times except while eating or exercising. Snack/Lunch time will be outdoors, weather permitting. All snacks are individually wrapped and nut free.
- All lesson plans accommodate physical distancing guidelines.
- Campers must use the restroom and wash their hands prior to arriving at SPCC. While at SPCC only one student will be permitted to use the restroom at a time. SPCC camp counselors will ensure students are using proper hand-washing techniques after using the restroom.
- 3 to 5-year-old summer camp sessions will not exceed 6 children. 6 to 10-year-old camp sessions will not exceed 15 children as outlined by the Anne Arundel County Department of Health.
- For the safety of all, please discuss with your children the importance of keeping their hands to themselves and listening to their camp counselors at all times.
- All belongings must be in a clearly labeled bag and cleaned between each visit to the center.
- Please make sure your camper brings a well-marked water bottle to camp. The water fountain will not be accessible to anyone except to refill their water bottle.
- Please do not arrive to drop off your child any earlier than 10 minutes prior to the start of camp, and be prompt in picking up your child on time. Parent/Guardian must stay with their camper until the camp start time.
